## Artist's Biography:

Angelica Sotiriou holds a Masters of Arts and a Masters of Fine Arts degree from the University of California at Los Angeles. Angelica studied under the tutelage of artists Lee Mullican, Laddie John Dill, Tom Wudl and British artist/printmaker Ian Colverson.

Angelica Sotiriou has been exhibiting her art and teaching art in Los Angeles and the greater communities of California for over three decades. She has worked as a sculptor, creating narrative figurative base-reliefs and currently creates large contemplative narrative acrylic paintings.

Her works are in private & public collections of various individuals and organizations including St. Katherine GOC (Redondo Beach), Orange County Art Museum, The Terranea Resort (Palos Verdes), The Francisco Martinez Dance Theater (Los Angeles) and Jerry Bruckheimer (Los Angeles).

Angelica has been an active and exhibiting artist in the Greater Los Angeles community since 2001.
