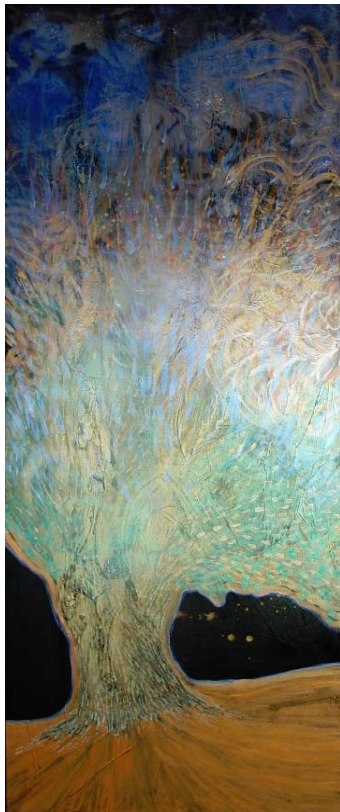
INTRODUCING THE “CROWN JEWEL GALLERY” AT ST. KATHERINE

The First Featured Works of Art by Angelica Sotiriou

TWO PAINTINGS INSPIRED BY A PILGRIMAGE TO OUR MONASTERY AT MOUNT SINAI

A group of Orthodox Christian pilgrims from our parish visited Mt. Sinai a few years ago. At the foot of the mountain we encountered The Chapel of the Burning Bush, built by Saint Helen in the 4th century, on the very place where Moses was commanded by God to remove his sandals, for he was standing upon holy ground. To this day the Burning Bush remains alive and grows right behind the chapel that is dedicated to the Mother of God. The Fathers of the Church and ancient Byzantine iconographers made a written and visual parallel theologically associating the Burning Bush



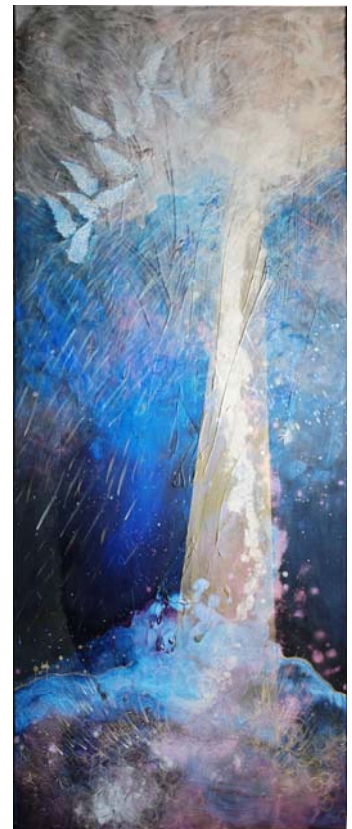
with The Theotokos. The bush that burned without being consumed by the flames is considered to be a type and prefiguration of The Incarnation, as The Theotokos conceived and gave birth within her the fire of God without being consumed. Our pilgrimage also took us to Nazareth, to the church of The Annunciation, where the Archangel Gabriel announced to The Virgin Mary that she was chosen by God to give birth to The Messiah, our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ!

Our own artist and art educator, Angelica Sotiriou, was one of those pilgrims who visited both of these sacred sites.

CONTEMPORARY ART WITH BIBLICAL THEMES

At the Knob Hill main entrance of our new Dr. Michael N. & Rosalind F. Halikis Administration Center, if you

turn right to ascend the stairs, you will notice two new contemporary paintings by Angelica Sotiriou decorating the west wall at the landing. The painting to the right looking up is entitled “Mary’s Yes” and it is the artist’s interpretation of The Theotokos’ free-will response to the Angel Gabriel regarding her virgin conception of Christ, “Let it be to me according to your word” (Luke 1:34-38). To the left of “Mary’s Yes” is a painting by the same artist entitled “I AM.” This painting shows the artist’s vision of the burning bush that Moses saw at the foot of



Mt. Sinai where God spoke to him (Exodus 3; Acts 7:30-34) and revealed to Moses His name, “I AM WHO I AM.” These two paintings complement each other for as Moses heard the voice through the angel of the Lord in a bush that burned yet was not consumed by the fire (contrary to nature), so the Virgin Mary accepted God’s will and conceived without a husband by The Holy Spirit (contrary to nature). The Orthodox Christian tradition of the association of The Theotokos with Moses and the burning bush has been handed down by traditional Byzantine iconography in the collection of

Welcome to summer! We are halfway through 2018 and are extremely grateful to those who have helped us reach 90% of our 2018 goal for pledged stewards. The Parish Council has determined that an average pledge of \$1500 is needed to meet our operating costs. Currently, 42% of our stewards are pledging less than \$700. **PAINTINGS DONATED AND ACCEPTED
 BY THE BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE**

These two paintings were referred by me and Mrs. Rosalind Halikis to the Beautification Committee (appointed by Parish Council President Mr. Bill Marutsos) and approved by the committee to be part of the permanent collection of our Crown Jewel Gallery. “Mary’s Yes” is a gift to the church by the artist herself, and “I AM” was donated by Mrs. Rosalind Halikis (herself an accomplished painter). Angelica Sotiriou Rausch, a longtime member of our congregation, holds an MFA from UCLA, and works out of her studio and gallery in the arts district of San Pedro. In an article published June 25, 2018 in Voyage, LA entitled “Check out Angelica Sotiriou’s Artwork” (<http://voyagela.com/interview/check-angelica-sotiriou-artwork/>) Angelica described her work as “large abstract contemplative narratives.” Her work has been inspired by the early Byzantine iconographic method of working from dark to light. Every painting is inspired by her personal meditation and contemplations, created in silence. 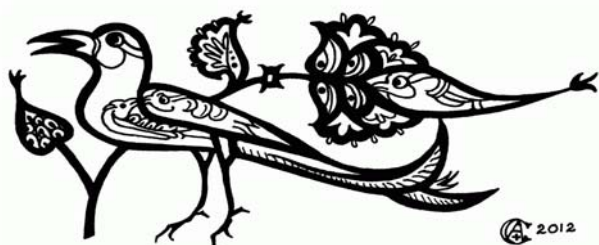
